









MHU3A Laptop and Projector Notes



Projector

<p style="color: red; text-align: center;">Physical connection of PC to Projector</p> <p>Connect Power lead and "Screen" Cable to Projector</p>	
<p>Connect other end of "Screen" Cable to Laptop</p>	
<p>If you want to use the Speakers in the Projector:</p> <p>Connect Speaker Leads to Laptop (Headphone Socket) and Projector (Audio Input Socket)</p>	
<p>Power Projector on</p>	
<p>If Screen not displayed by the Projector, press Source Search and select Computer</p> <p style="color: red;">If a screen still cannot be seen on the Laptop you may need to press the Alt and F4 keys simultaneously</p>	
<p>If Image is not aligned correctly use Keystone Adjustment</p> <p>Note: if the internal speakers are used then the volume can be changed here</p>

<p>Note: There is a Remote Handset that can operate the Projector. The controls on the remote duplicate those on the Projector Control Panel</p> <p>Note. For certain displays you may need to change the Aspect Ratio of the projector. Pressing the Aspect Key on the Remote Handset toggles through the possible ratios</p>	
<p>To Power Projector Off</p> <p>Switch off and wait until Fan stops before disconnecting Power Lead This is vital as bulb must cool before disconnection</p>	

- Note 1: Slide Shows can be run on Projector With SD card or Memory Stickjust insert card or stick and press Source Search button
- Note 2: the laptop is not required for this slide show, but only pictures (jpg, gifs...) can be shown not a PowerPoint Presentation

Laptop (Vista)

<p>Start-up as with any Laptop Plug in mains if possible and press Power On</p>	
<p>Shutdown by clicking on Start...Right Arrow (next to lock) and Shut Down. Note: other ways to shut down may only go to <i>Sleep, Hibernation</i> or <i>Hybrid sleep mode</i></p>	
<p>Playing DVD on Laptop</p>	<p>Just poke DVD in Player and "<i>InterVideo Win DVD</i>" program will/should start</p>

Wireless Presentation Tool

<p>Plug in Adapter to any USB Socket</p>	
<p>And use Remote Handset as a Mouse and Laser Pointer</p>	

Slide Show using Vista “Windows Photo Gallery”

Start with the pictures on a Memory Stick, CD or DVD.
Put Memory stick, CD or DVD in Laptop

A popup screen similar to the one shown will/may appear:(...it may take quite a few seconds until the Laptop decides what to do with the Memory stick, CD or DVD)

In the pop-up Click on “**View Pictures using Windows**”



Note: some times the pop-up may not appear only the Autoplay on the Taskbar

If so click on the **Autoplay**



You can either manually step through the pictures or play them automatically by clicking on the **Big Square Button** to start the slide show





When Slide show is playing the Control Panel disappears but can be brought back to life by just moving the mouse.

The control panel allows you to change the timings, themes, loop/shuffle or exit the program



PowerPoint Presentation

<p>Start with Presentation on a Memory Stick, CD or DVD Put Memory stick, CD or DVD in Laptop In the pop-up Click on “Open folder to view files”</p> <p>Note: if popup does not appear click on Autoplay in Taskbar as shown on previous page</p>	
<p>A Window similar to that shown on right should appear</p> <p>Double click of file that contains Presentation and PowerPoint should open</p>	

Note: There are many ways to start and use “Windows Photo Gallery”, “PowerPoint” or any other application in Windows the above descriptions show only one possible way.
